E-books

TAFE SA has access to e-books from **ProQuest Ebook Central**. These are available via the library catalogue for TAFE SA staff and students.

- Titles are available online 24/7
- You can print and permanently download a limited number of pages

Finding e-books:


Go to the library catalogue at https://tafesa.spydus.com.

Enter keywords from the title or subject of the e-book you are looking for and select **E-books** from the dropdown menu.




Then click the search icon.


A list of e-books related to your search will appear on the next page. Click on the title of the e-book for more information about the e-book



or click **View availability** from the list of e-books, then click on the link **Click HERE to go to the e-book**.



The following screen will appear (if you are off-campus):



If you have never had an e-book account with TAFE SA:

If you have never had an e-book account via the TAFE SA Library service, please click on **Create Account**.

Fill out the form that appears (making sure you use your <u>TAFE E-mail address</u>); tick the **I agree to ProQuest's Privacy Policy and Terms of Service**; and click on **Create Account**:


It may take up to 1 business day for your e-book account to be approved if you have created the account off-campus (the process is immediate if you have created your account whilst you are on-campus).

You will be sent an e-mail advising you that you have access once approved.


If you have any problems, please see library staff.

If you already have an e-book account with TAFE SA:

Use the login you created for accessing e-books and enter these details into the login box.




The following screen will appear (this screen also appears straight away when you are accessing e-books on campus):



At the top of the page are the explanations of what options are available for this e-book. For instance, in this example, there are 3 copies of this e-book available for download. You can: read online; download the book (for a limited time); download PDF chapters (up to 54 pages for this e-book); and copy sections of the book (54 pages for this e-book). It also states how many pages are available for you to chapter download.



You can click on **Read Online** to read the entire title online (provided you have Internet access). This is recommended as it provides a lot of functionality.




When reading online, the screen will look like:




- There are options at the top of the screen. Explanations for these options are below: Full Download- this will download the entire book into Adobe Digital Editions (if you want to read offline) Chapter Download- select the chapter you want to download on the left, then click on this icon to download the PDF version of that chapter Copy- gives you the option to copy parts of the page that can then be pasted into a document Print to PDF- can save a page range as a PDF (limits apply) Add to Bookshelf- adds to a folder on your e-book account. To access, click Bookshelf at the top of the screen Share Link- provides a link to the current page of the e-book that can be copied and sent to others 99 Get Citation- provides an example reference in your chosen referencing style. Please note- may not match the format required by your lecturer Highlight- you can use this to add a colour to selected text Add Note- allows you to add a note to pages of the text
- Add Bookmark- adds a bookmark to the current page of the e-book
- Zoom In Zoom Out- use this to make the text larger or smaller
- Zoom...- gives the option to change the view on screen

Page Intro of 518 Go to Page (type a page number) or choose Previous Page Next Page You can download a limited number of chapters by selecting **Download PDF** beside each chapter. As mentioned on the previous page, there are limits on the number of pages that can be downloaded as PDF.


To access the e-book <u>offline</u> for up to a week, you can click on **Download Book**. You will then be asked to **Sign In** with your e-book login or **Create Account** (if you haven't already)







On the next screen, select the type of device you are using, then click on Continue:



On the following page, you have the option of downloading the software or app (by clicking on the appropriate button). If you have already downloaded the software, just click on **Done with this step**.




NOTE: you need to make sure you have the following software on your device before you can read the e-books:

- Laptop- Adobe Digital Editions
- IOS (iPad, iPhone, iPod)- Adobe Digital Editions
- Android (Phone, Tablet)- Adobe Digital Editions


If you have downloaded the software and are asked for an Adobe ID, you can either Create an ID; enter an existing Adobe ID; or tick the box next to I want to authorize my computer without an ID then click on Authorize. On the next screen also click on the Authorize button




On the following page, you have the option to download the e-book onto your device for 1 to 7 days, sometimes more (you select from a drop-down box). Once you have selected the loan time, click on **Download**.



The file may appear at the bottom-left of the screen (if using the Google Chrome browser on a laptop/PC). Click on this file to open the software and view the book. Alternatively, you can open the Adobe Digital Editions software on your device and select the book from the opening page.




Once the e-book opens, you can look through each page as you would a normal online document. You can jump to parts of the book from the menu on the side.



You can also search within the contents of the e-book by clicking on the magnifying glass icon tab, entering your search term and then looking at the results.

You can select and copy parts of the book that can be pasted into online documents. Be aware that these e-books are covered by copyright, so you can only cut and paste the equivalent of 1 chapter or 10% of the e-book (the e-book software will prevent you copying any further information once the limit has been reached).



Once the **Loan Length** you chose at the beginning of the download ends, the e-book will appear as **Expired** in the Adobe Digital Editions library:



To download the e-book again, you need to follow the same process again, starting at the Library Catalogue.

Other e-books

Some databases, e.g. Emerald, also contain e-books which can be searched and read in the database.

To reference an e-book accessed via a library platform (Harvard Referencing)

Use the same format as for books but list the name of the e-book platform after the publisher. e.g.:

Forsyth, P 2008, *The art of successful business communication*, Institution of Engineering and Electronics, ProQuest Ebook Central.
