E-books

Study Guide



TAFE SA has access to e-books from **ProQuest Ebook Central**. These are available via the library catalogue for TAFE SA staff and students.

- Titles are available online 24/7
- You can print and permanently download a limited number of pages

Finding e-books:

Go to the library catalogue at https://tafesa.spydus.com.

Enter keywords from the title or subject of the e-book you are looking for and select **E-books** from the dropdown menu.



Then click the search icon.


To view an e-book, click View availability, then click on the link to go to the e-book.

Create Account

First time users will need to create a new account – this is best done on campus where your password can be automatically activated

- Email address Use your TAFE SA email address this will become your username.
- Password Minimum 8 characters


Click **Create Account.** You will get an email confirmation with a link, which you must click to activate your login. If you are off-campus when you create your account, your email confirmation may not arrive until the next working day.




Read Online - You can browse a title for 10 minutes. To access it longer, or to print or copy pages, you will be asked to sign in and take out a loan. The loan period for most e-books is 7 days. If you need longer access, simply take out another loan when the first one runs out.



While you're reading online you can also download the book or chapters, copy and print pages, highlight text and add bookmarks. Each book will tell you how many pages you can print and copy.





Download - You can also download in PDF format to your own device to read offline (there is NO printing or copying). It can be accessed for up to 7 days and must be viewed on the device it was downloaded to.

You will need **Adobe Digital Editions** (for PCs/laptops) to read offline, which you can download at the same time. Follow the onscreen prompts to install. When you use Adobe Digital Editions for the first time it may prompt you for an Adobe ID - just click **Use without an Adobe ID** at the bottom. An Adobe ID will be required if you wish to transfer the downloaded e-book to another device.

Devices using iOS or Android need an app supporting Adobe DRM to read the e-book. ProQuest recommend the **Bluefire Reader** free app. You will need to set up a free Adobe account and obtain an Adobe ID to access.



Other e-books

Some databases, e.g. Emerald, also contain e-books which can be searched and read in the database.

To reference an e-book accessed via a library platform

Use the same format as for books, but list the name of the e-book platform after the publisher. e.g.:

Forsyth, P 2008, *The art of successful business communication*, Institution of Engineering and Electronics, ProQuest Ebook Central.
